## God is the strength of his people

Most of us must have experienced, at least once in our lives, a situation in which we had to make a decision to stand up for what we knew to be right - even though we were aware that by doing so we risked unpopularity. This is sometimes referred to as the `Tall Poppy Syndrome', a very sound metaphor, since the tallest plant in any group is most likely, by virtue of its height, to sustain accidental or deliberate damage from passing traffic, animals or people.



The dangers risked by the tall poppy are rewarded by the success of the plant in spreading its next generation. Other plants have developed different survival techniques.

One amazing plant is the Dandelion; it shows a variety of skills. Its thick, deep root system taps and stores deep water supplies which many other plants cannot reach. The light-blocking spread of its leaf rosette keeps other plants at bay. It has the ability to produce many hundreds of double-seeded ovaries from the inflorescence of each golden head, and the cunning to enlist human help to spread those seeds as we count the hours. Perhaps its most impressive trick is to develop its head at the safest height - which varies with its surroundings. In safe, undisturbed places we see dandelion heads held high, atop long stalks, but when we come to cut the lawn we find the plant's head hunched down, almost without a stem, below the level of the grass, its developing seeds well protected from any mower.

It is a great life-skill to survive by adapting to the changing situation. For survival and success it is essential to be aware of the environment and its changes, and to be willing to learn and use appropriate new skills. Now if the dandelion can do it, then surely we can too!
