First Reading: The Wedding-Feast of the Lord, Isaiah 62:1-5

For Sion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch. The nations shall see your righteousness, and all the kings your glory, and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will give. You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God. You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate, but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the Lord delights in you, and your land shall be married. For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your sons marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you.

Response to the Psalm: Proclaim the wonders of the Lord among all the peoples.

Second Reading: Gifts of the Spirit, 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

Brothers and Sisters: There are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. For to one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are empowered by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! God called us through the Gospel, so that we may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia!

The Gospel: - The Wedding-Feast at Cana, John 2:1-11

At that time: There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding seventy or one hundred litres. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, 'Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast.' So they took it. When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now.' This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

Gospel Reflection Sunday 19 January

As we settle rather icily into a new year, John's Gospel gifts us a big visual drama, the start of something; the only account of the wedding feast at Cana. It is there, not as a promotion of conviviality, but as the first of the seven signs the Gospel writer uses to reveal Jesus as the Messiah and to lead us to belief. It underscores too Jesus' move from the family to the public sphere. Mary apparently has some role in the festivities and looks to her son to do something to avoid the huge humiliation pending as the wineskins run dry. Despite his apparent rebuff: "Woman, what has this to do with me? My hour has not yet come." Mary demonstrates her faith in him as she beckons the servants. She defers to whatever action he might take.

The use of the stone water jars used in the Jewish rite of purification signal a change from the Old Covenant to the abundance of the New Testament – literally brimful. The miracle occurs quietly between Jesus and the servants who are filling the huge vessels with water. It is worth noting that the first witnesses of this "sign" are not the wedding guests or the master of the feast or the bridegroom but these servants. From their mouths the miracle will spread. Jesus does not broadcast the sign. The master of the feast is astounded when called to test the wine. The best is kept until last. This "good wine" is a symbol of Jesus the Messiah, long anticipated; its colour that of blood sacrifice.

Until Jesus touches our lives, all we have is a lack. Allowing faith in him to direct our lives opens up a superabundance of transformation. God's Glory manifested.
