First Reading: The Test of Speech

Ecclesiasticus 27:4-7

When a sieve is shaken, the refuse appears; so a person's filth in his thoughts. The kiln tests the potter's vessels; likewise the test of a person is in his reasoning. The fruit discloses the cultivation of a tree; so the expression of a thought discloses the cultivation of a person's mind. Do not praise a man before you hear him reason, for this is the test of people.

Second Reading: Christ's Victory over Death

1 Corinthians 15:54-58

Brothers and Sisters: When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: 'Death is swallowed up in victory.' 'O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?' The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labour is not in vain.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! Shine as lights in the world, holding fast to the word of life. Alleluia!

The Gospel: Judging Others

Luke 6:39-45

At that time: Jesus told his disciples a parable: 'Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not both fall into a pit? A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher. Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me take out the speck that is in your eye", when you yourself do not see the log that is in your own eye? You hypocrite! First take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take out the speck that is in your brother's eye. 'For no good tree bears bad fruit, nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit, for each tree is known by its own fruit. For figs are not gathered from thorn bushes, nor are grapes picked from a bramble bush. The good person out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil person out of his evil treasure produces evil, for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks.'

The growing pain of fruit trees

Jesus is asking us a question in this week's Gospel (Luke 6:39-45). We are being asked to look into ourselves, to reflect on our own heart. How do we do this? I'm sure most people know what I mean by the phrase, 'catching ourselves thinking'. It's a moment when we are thinking about something and we see ourselves thinking about it. These are perfect moments to reflect on our heart. So next time you 'catch yourself thinking', pause for a moment, and ask yourself, "Am I as I should be?" If we spend a few moments doing this and conclude we are indeed as we should be, we are not being truthful with ourselves. If we look with a modicum of honesty we should find ourselves blushing. Yet knowing we are sinners, works in progress, is the first vital step in growing in fruitful faith. Being truly honest with ourselves is painful, if we are doing it correctly. But we can not progress in our personal faith until we truly know our own heart. Painful as it may be, it is the path to genuine and everlasting joy.

Without taking the time to honestly scrutinize ourselves we will follow the path of the crowd. We will find ourselves in the same position as the hypocrites in our Gospel. The Lord calls them hypocrites because they judge the sins of others, so that they themselves might seem just. What we call today, 'Virtue signalling'. They see all the faults in everyone else while being oblivious to their own many sins. Instead, they should be quiet and pray for the person being publicly judged, because they too are sinners. Yet they prefer to become rotten fruit, and when we are in such a state, as the Lord teaches us, we can't bear good fruit.

The task before us is not an easy one, but we must perceive knowing that we are taking part in a great test, a test of love. So we should never stop trying until we take our last breath, confident that in the end, as St Paul tells us in our second reading this week, all will be well, "Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labour is not in vain."
