First Reading: A Wandering Aramean

Moses spoke to the people: 'The priest shall take the basket from your hand and set it down before the altar of the Lord your God. And you shall make response before the Lord your God, "A wandering Aramean was my father. And he went down into Egypt and sojourned there, few in number, and there he became a nation, great, mighty, and populous. And the Egyptians treated us harshly and humiliated us and laid on us hard labour. Then we cried to the Lord, the God of our fathers, and the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. And the Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with great deeds of terror, with signs and wonders. And he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. And behold, now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground, which you, O Lord, have given me." And you shall set it down before the Lord your God and worship before the Lord your God.'

Response to the Psalm: Be with me, O Lord, in my distress.

Second Reading: Profession of Faith

Brothers and Sisters: What does Scripture say? 'The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart' (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. For the Scripture says, 'Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame.' For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. For, 'everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'

Gospel Acclamation: Glory and Praise to you, O Christ. One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God. Glory and Praise to you, O Christ.

The Gospel: Jesus Tested in the Desert

At that time: Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And he ate nothing during those days. And when they were over, he was hungry. The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread.' And Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "Man shall not live by bread alone." ' And the devil took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, and said to him, 'To you I will give all this authority and their glory, for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours.' And Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve." ' And he took him to Jerusalem and set him on the pinnacle of the temple and said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, "He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you", and "On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone." ' And Jesus answered him, 'It is said, "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test." ' And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from him until an opportune time.

Obviously, when we read the scripture, we do so in the context of our own world and timeframe. Today's Gospel particularly seems to chime with the upending of a world order that has lasted for decades and an inversion of accepted certainties in how we treat our fellow human beings. It really is a time to check our moral compasses; to be sure of our relationship with God; to conscientiously fill ourselves with the energy and inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Lent, of course, is upon us.

In the Gospel, the devil delivers three temptations to Jesus, physically weakened after forty days fasting in the desert, but, crucially filled with the Holy Spirit. Each time Jesus resists by reinforcing the power of "the Lord Your God" and the essential nature of our relationship with God. His resistance is twofold, as Son of God but also as Jesus, the son of Mary. Trust and faith in God defeat the devil but evil is always waiting "for an opportune time".

How do we relate the temptations of Jesus to the challenges we must face as Christians? Perhaps the first is the most straightforward to understand during Lent. It is easy to succumb to looking after our own needs but this can blind us to our responsibilities under the Golden Rule : *In everything, do to others what you would have them do to you. Matt. 7:12.* Our own needs cannot be paramount. Secondly, the majority of us aren't interested in world domination. However, we may feel the need to exert control in our relationships with family, friends and colleagues. Ultimately, we must put our faith in God. We are never really in charge.

The last temptation of Jesus shows the devil cleverly playing into the accepted Judaic belief in a "Messianic reveal" based around the Temple. What a spectacle that would have been! How easy faith in the Son of God, buoyed up on celestial wings! What Jesus did offer us, in contrast, was a faith fired into focus by his death on a cross, taking our sins upon himself, an act of total submission for the redemption of humanity. He was to become the perfect sacrifice for our sake. For us, the call is not to confuse success in worldly terms, with faithfulness to God. Throughout his Ministry, Jesus would uncomfortably focus on the small acts of faith of the poor, the marginalized. Those who sat at the high table were not the inheritors of the Kingdom.

In Lent, may we focus on how we live out the reality of: "Man shall not live by bread alone."
