First Reading: Passover in the Plains of Jerico

In those days: The Lord said to Joshua, 'Today I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you.' While the people of Israel were encamped at Gilgal, they kept the Passover on the fourteenth day of the month in the evening on the plains of Jericho. And the day after the Passover, on that very day, they ate of the produce of the land, unleavened cakes and parched grain. And the manna ceased the day after they ate of the produce of the land. And there was no longer manna for the people of Israel, but they ate of the fruit of the land of Canaan that year.

Response to the Psalm: Taste and See that the Lord is Good.

Second Reading: Reconciled in Christ

Brothers and Sisters: If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ; God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ: be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Gospel Acclamation: Praise and honour to you, Lord Jesus. I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you'. Praise and honour to you, Lord Jesus.

The Gospel: The Prodigal Son

At that time: The tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, 'This man receives sinners and eats with them.' So he told them this parable: 'There was a man who had two sons. And the younger of them said to his father, "Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me." And he divided his property between them. Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living. And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything. 'But when he came to himself, he said, "How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants.' " 'And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. And the son said to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son." But the father said to his servants, "Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found." And they began to celebrate. 'Now his older son was in the field, and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. And he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. And he said to him, "Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf, because he has received him back safe and sound." But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him, but he answered his father, "Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command, yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!" And he said to him, "Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found."

'Mothering Sunday'

Today is Mothering Sunday. A Happy and Blessed day to all our Mams!

Mothers day owes it's origin to Mother Church. On this fourth Sunday of Lent, every year, on what we call 'Laetare or rejoicing Sunday,' the Church celebrates her Motherhood, as Mother of many peoples and nations. This is the time of year when Catechumens, (i.e.) those preparing for Baptism at the Easter Vigil, will come to new birth in the womb of the Church. The Church is not an impersonal institution, she's a universal Mother. So like any good Mother she serves her children with life, with truth, with faith, with love and forgiveness. The Church is such a good Mother that in English tradition from earliest times this day became known as ' Mothering Sunday' in dedication to those who would soon receive Baptism at Easter. So what can Holy Mother Church say to us on this fourth Sunday of Lent? The Gospel says," While he was still a long way off, his Father saw him. (Luke: 15 – 20). Still a long way off! A dot on the horizon. Doesn't that mean he was on the lookout for him? From the day he left, watching, waiting, praying, like many a Father or Mother? Doesn't it illustrate how God the Father feels about each one of us, how much every one of us matters to him? How anxious he is that we all come back to him? He didn't just wait for the Son, he ran to him, and clasped him in his arms. A sheer explosion of generosity and joy. Like the love of a good Mother or Father. As St. Paul says in today's second reading to the Ephesians, "At one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as Children of the light." May that light of Christ shine upon all Mothers today, and bless them in a special way.

Pray especially today for all Mothers and Fathers who act as foster parents, or who have adopted children. They are reflections of the love of God.

Second Collection Next Week – Sick and Retired Priests - At the present moment there are 67 active priests in our diocese – and just over 48 have retired. When we began Forward Together In Hope in 2014 we had 110 active priests in the Diocese. It is quite likely that by 2030 we will have much less than 50 active priests and far more who will need specialist care. These priests have spent their lives serving us in our diocese. We now have 86....and many will want to continue to serve without having the responsibilities of being a parish priest. Our collection goes to enabling them to live as full a life as they possibly can.
