First Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

Thus says the Wisdom of God: The Lord possessed me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of old. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth, before he had made the earth with its fields, or the first of the dust of the world. John Chapter 16 is sometimes referred to as Christ's Farewell Discourse with his disciples.

In that sense today's Gospel for Trinity Sunday continues the fresh message of Pentecost. The apostles still have some way to go but Jesus is promising them the big armory. We have followed their very human failings but now the Spirit of Truth will take over from their mentor and leader Jesus. In the last sentence of the Gospel, Jesus reflects on the dynamic between Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Spirit of Truth is God's active presence and power in the world, guiding, inspiring and empowering those who believe.

Inspiration is key here. We all have sources that stir and energise us in our faith. These may be in the lives of the saints or in the quiet unfolding of and witness to faith in family, friends or in our faith community. We remember how Jesus' eyes so often fell on the humble showing small acts of faith rather than the ostentatious.

How wonderful the recent images of Pope Leo XIV blessing the cyclists competing in the Giro d'Italia as the final stage began with an unprecedented ride through the Vatican Gardens! "You are role models for young people all over the world" he told them. In the faces of the young cyclists, however, there was a clear connection to something greater; an encounter, an inspiration drawn from our new Pope.

Let us try to inspire and be inspired by the Gift of the Spirit of Truth!

## Statement on abortion amendments to the Crime and Policing Bill

We are deeply alarmed by two amendments that have been submitted to the Crime and Policing Bill. These would further reduce the protection of unborn children and their mothers. Out of compassion for pregnant women and their babies, the Catholic Church believes that the law should offer protection to the unborn and that society should offer support for parents who need it. The proposed amendments would take our law further in the wrong direction.

Under New Clause 1, the criminal law would no longer apply in relation to women acting to end their pregnancy, at any time, including up to and during birth. This is likely to result in an increased illegal use of abortion pills and an escalation in late-term at-home abortions, putting the lives and health of many pregnant women and their babies in grave danger. It would undermine the necessary judicial mechanisms to protect women from being coerced or pressurized into an abortion.

**New Clause 20** would decriminalise abortion completely up to and during birth. This would leave women with little protection against forced or coerced abortions by families and third parties. Abortion would become available on demand and up to birth. There is little support amongst the general public for such an extreme law which entirely overturns the existing framework and totally disregards the humanity of the unborn baby.

Pregnant women and their unborn babies both have inherent dignity, and as such, mothers need to be supported in welcoming new life. Several Catholic organisations work tirelessly to provide support for parents and children. This is the truly safe, compassionate, and caring response to parents who are expecting a baby. I thank them for their work.

I encourage all faithful Catholics, and those who care for the lives of children and mothers, to contact their MPs and encourage them to oppose these amendments.

**'Hope in a Time of Darkness'** – A Lecture by His Eminence Cardinal Timothy Radcliffe OP, Monday 23 June 2025; 7:45pm, Galilee Chapel, Durham Cathedral. Durham Cathedral Institute is delighted to be hosting this year's Bishop Dunn Memorial Lecture of the Centre for Catholic Studies at Durham University, hearing from speaker Cardinal Timothy Radcliffe and respondent Prof Anna Rowlands.

Cardinal Radcliffe is a distinguished Catholic priest, theologian, and church leader. Between 1992 and 2001, he served as Master of the Order of Preachers (also known as the Dominican Order). Radcliffe received an honorary Doctorate of Divinity from the University of Oxford in 2003; in 2023, he was appointed preacher to the Catholic Church's Synod on Synodality, and was made cardinal by Pope Francis in December 2024.

Anna Rowlands (respondent) is St Hilda Professor of Catholic Social Thought and Practice at Durham University. She is a political theologian whose research interests include the ethics of migration and the tradition of Catholic Social Teaching.
