First Reading: The Martyrs in Safe Keeping

Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14

I, John, saw another angel ascending from the rising of the sun, with the seal of the living God, and he called with a loud voice to the four angels who had been given power to harm earth and sea, saying, 'Do not harm the earth or the sea or the trees, until we have sealed the servants of our God on their foreheads.' And I heard the number of the sealed, one hundred and forty-four thousand, sealed from every tribe of the sons of Israel. After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, 'Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels were standing round the throne and round the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, saying, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.' Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from where have they come?' I said to him, 'Sir, you know.' And he said to me, 'These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.'

1 John 3:1-3

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven.'

Remembering the Holy Souls in Purgatory

One of the greatest trials of our faith is the death of loved ones. The pain cuts deep and changes us forever. Death certainly changes our relationship with them, but it does not end it. That is, we are always united with our loved ones in faith, in life and death. This is why Holy Souls Day, which we celebrate this Sunday, is so important. It reminds us that we can intercede for our loved ones who have gone before us with our prayers.

In the bible the two books of Maccabees speak about the times during the Jewish revolt against Syria in the second century, before Jesus. In one incident during the war, when king Antiochus' Syrian soldiers desecrated the Temple, many of the Jews gave in to the Syrians spiritually, they lost faith. While other Jews remained faithful to God, trusting in Him and fighting on to the end, trusting in Him every step of the way. The First Book of Maccabees speaks mostly of the battles with the Syrians while the Second Book of Maccabees tells us of the trials the faithful were forced to endure. Even though they saw their sons and even their babies brutalised and killed, they remained faithful to God.

However, the most important battle against the Syrians, from our perspective, was against Georgies the Idumean. Through God's grace Judas was ultimately victorious. After the battle Judas went to bury his men who had fallen, but as he did so he found that under their tunics they were wearing pagan amulets. It was clear to him that they were slain because they had momentarily become weak and turned to the pagan gods of the Syrians. It was this that made Judas turn to God on their behalf and pray for them, even though they were already dead.

"In doing this Judas acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch as he had the resurrection of the dead in view; for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death." (2 Maccabees 12:43-46) Our Gospel is Christ's great promise to those who remain faithful to him, the resurrection and eternal life. But not just eternal life, eternal life in the love of God. We refer to this as heaven. Heaven is not only a place but a state of being. When we bask in the radiance of God, as we see Him as He truly is. But to achieve this we must stand firm in the faith, like the Jews who remained faithful to God in the war with the Syrians, we too must stand firm against the overwhelming odds we face from the world. And like Judas, and the Christians of the last 2,000 years, continue to offer prayers and Masses for our loved ones who have gone before us.
