First Reading: The Water of Life

Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

In those days: The angel brought me back to the door of the Temple, and behold, water was issuing from below the threshold of the Temple towards the east (for the Temple faced east). The water was flowing down from below the south end of the threshold of the Temple, south of the altar. Then he brought me out by way of the north gate and led me round on the outside to the outer gate that faces towards the east; and behold, the water was trickling out on the south side. And he said to me, 'This water flows towards the eastern region and goes down into the Arabah, and enters the sea; when the water flows into the sea, the water will become fresh. And wherever the river goes, every living creature that swarms will live, and there will be very many fish. For this water goes there, that the waters of the sea may become fresh; so everything will live where the river goes. And on the banks, on both sides of the river, there will grow all kinds of trees for food. Their leaves will not wither, nor their fruit fail, but they will bear fresh fruit every month, because the water for them flows from the sanctuary. Their fruit will be for food, and their leaves for healing.'

Response to the Psalm: The waters of a river give joy to God's city, the holy place, the abode of the Most High.

Second reading: The Master Builder

1 Corinthians 3:9c-11, 16-17

Brothers and Sisters: You are God's building. According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building upon it. Let each one take care how he builds upon it. For no one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy him. For God's temple is holy, and you are that temple.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia. I have chosen and consecrated this house, says the Lord, that my name may be there for ever. Alleluia.

Gospel: Rebuilding the Temple John 2:13-22

The Passover of the Jews was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the Temple he found those who were selling oxen and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting there. And making a whip of cords, he drove them all out of the Temple, with the sheep and oxen. And he poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables. And he told those who sold the pigeons, 'Take these things away; do not make my Father's house a house of trade.' His disciples remembered that it was written, 'Zeal for your house will consume me.' So the Jews said to him, 'What sign do you show us for doing these things?' Jesus answered them, 'Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews then said, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this Temple, and will you raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking about the temple of his body. When therefore he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the Scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

Today's Gospel is a very familiar one. The context is the Temple in Jerusalem; the holiest place for the Jews, particularly as they commemorate the Passover. The Temple is the subject of the First and Second Readings too. St Paul's Temple is very much in line with the Temple referenced by Jesus in his riposte to the astonished Jews amidst the overturned tables and the harsh flutter of pigeon wings breaking the outraged silence. Jesus is the Temple; his divinity should be the focus of those who believe and give worship. He prefigures his own Resurrection in contrast to bricks and mortar, the fate of the Temple. Unlike those struggling to comprehend this scene, Jesus knows the Romans will destroy the Temple in seventy years.

To be fair, the Jewish worshippers are simply doing what they have always done and Jesus will have witnessed this many times but a reckoning is coming. Roman coins are changed for Temple coins to buy a sacrificial offering. However their relationship with God has become secondary to human trade, which Jesus so angrily rejects. Soon there will be only one sacrifice in this new Covenant: his own.

St Paul in his letter to the early Christian community in Corinth, which he founded, is trying to make them individually more mature in their faith. They have been quarrelling about leadership, how to worship, who to admit but St Paul is unequivocal: "You are God's building." Like Jesus in the Gospel, St Paul is very clear; each Christian must embody their faith. From that strong foundation, the church will flourish.

Today is Remembrance Sunday and we rightly honour those who made the ultimate sacrifice in war for future generations. We pray for the brave members of our Armed Services today. Let us take time too to pray for those whose lives have been lost in war in the ongoing conflicts in Gaza, Ukraine and the recent horrors in South Sudan. Let us pray for the children whose lives have been ruined and reach out for love and support. Let us pray for peace, reconciliation and justice. Let us pray for a fairer world. Let us pray for the dignity of each individual Temple of humanity. Help us to learn, Lord Jesus.

Masses are generally live-streamed daily at 10am every day, except Monday, streamed at 7pm, and alternate Sundays when Mass is live-streamed at either 10am or 11am. An * on the Mass table indicates streamed Masses.
