Second Reading: The Son of God in Power

Romans 1:1-7

Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an Apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy Scriptures, concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead: Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of his name among all the nations, including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ. To all those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel — which means, God with us. Alleluia.

The Gospel: Emmanuel Matthew 1:18-24

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to send her away quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, 'Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: 'Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel' — which means, God with us. When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife.

St. Joseph's Quiet Life

Prophecy, mysticism, and cold reality come crashing together in our gospel this week, the 4th Sunday of Advent (Matthew 1:23).

There is no logic or reason in dreams, this is why if we become semi lucid in a dream we can't read any writing we see in the dream. And this is why we know that although this took place when Joseph was asleep, the clear and direct message from the angel makes it more of a vision than a dream, or perhaps a vision within a dream.

It's difficult for us living today to grasp the magnitude of what the angel asked Joseph to do, it meant going against everything Joseph was brought up to believe. But such was the power and clarity of the vision Joseph does not question its veracity. It must have greatly helped that Joseph, as a devout Jew, was undoubtedly aware of the prophecy of Issiah concerning the birth of the messiah, and after the vision he seems to understand what his role will be too. God offered Joseph a vision of grace and he accepted.

The qualities of holiness include prudence and a quiet confidence in God's will. Joseph was gifted with both.

In a spiritually intuitive way he knew his role was to be the earthly guardian of the messiah. To care for him when he was at his most vulnerable. To guard him, along with Mary, until he was able to present himself to his people and complete his mission as the messiah. Our Gospel also points to the coming divine presence of God among his people by fulfilling the prophecy of Issiah. It promises forgiveness, redemption, and a road to salvation. But at its heart is St Joseph. He can sometimes be overlooked or not receive the admiration he is due. But in his quiet yet resolute faith, working quietly in the background, he is a model for us to follow this coming Christmas time. So, like Joseph, let us stand back and place Jesus at the centre of all we say and do, so that through us the people we come close to have the opportunity to grasp the real meaning and power of Christmas.

Readings for the Holy Family:

First reading: Honour Your Father and Your Mother

Ecclesiasticus 3:2-6, 12-14

The Lord honoured the father above the children, and he confirmed the judgement of the mother over her sons. Whoever honours his father atones for sins, and whoever glorifies his mother is like one who lays up treasure. Whoever honours his father will be gladdened by his own children, and when he prays he will be heard. Whoever glorifies his father will have long life, and whoever obeys the Lord will refresh his mother. O son, help your father in his old age and do not grieve him as long as he lives; even if he is lacking in understanding, show indulgence; in all your strength do not despise him. For kindness to a father will not be forgotten, and against your sins it will be credited to you.

Response to the Psalm: Blessed are all who fear the Lord, and walk in his ways.

Second Reading: The Overcoat of Love

Colossians 3:12-21

Brothers and sisters: Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Wives, submit to your husbands, as is fitting in the Lord. Husbands, love your wives, and do not be harsh with them. Children, obey your parents in everything, for this pleases the Lord. Fathers, do not provoke your children, lest they become discouraged.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia. May the peace of Christ reign in your hearts; let the message of Christ find a home with you. Alleluia.

The Gospel: The Flight to Egypt

Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

When the Magi had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him.' And he rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed to Egypt and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: 'Out of Egypt I called my son.' But when Herod died, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, saying, 'Rise, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child's life are dead.' And he rose and took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he withdrew to the district of Galilee. And he went and lived in a city called Nazareth, so that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled, that he would be called a Nazarene.
