**First reading: The Servant of the Lord**

**Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7**

Thus says the Lord: Behold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my Spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations. He will not cry aloud or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a faintly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice. He will not grow faint or be discouraged till he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his law. 'I am the Lord; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you; I will give you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.'

**Second Reading: Peter Preaching**

**Acts 10:34-38**

In those days: Peter opened his mouth and said: 'Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ — he is Lord of all — you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.'

**Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia. The heavens opened and the Father's voice resounded:**

'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Alleluia.

**The Gospel: The Baptism of Jesus**

**Matthew 3:13-17**

At that time: Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptised by him. John would have prevented him, saying, 'I need to be baptised by you, and do you come to me?' But Jesus answered him, 'Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfil all righteousness.' Then he consented. And when Jesus was baptised, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; and behold, a voice from heaven said, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.'

### The Baptism of the Lord

The reading from Matthew's Gospel today is often used as the scripture reading in a Baptism service. Inevitably there will be several people in the congregation who are not regular church goers, so when I do a short reflection on this reading, I ask everyone to consider the enormity of what we are about to do. How important the sacrament is. Jesus insisted on being baptised, even though John said it should be the other way round – Jesus should be baptising John. Jesus would not hear of this saying, 'Let it be so for now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfil all righteousness.' Jesus was setting an example for all those present and indeed everyone, right through to us today. Also, at the end of St. Matthew's Gospel, the last thing Jesus commands the disciples to do is, 'Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations; baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.'

These two parts of Matthew's Gospel show with great clarity, how important the sacrament of Baptism is; so important that Jesus chose to be baptised as an example to us, and the last thing he commanded his disciples to do was to baptise the nations. We would do well, now and again, especially when we attend a Baptism, to fully appreciate how important this beautiful sacrament is. We are obeying Jesus's command to baptise the nations more than 2000 years after he issued the command.
